VP Urges OUT to Establish Youth Programmes

The Vice President of the United Republic of Tanzania (VP), Hon. Samia Suluhu Hassan urged the Open University of Tanzania (OUT) to establish youth training programmes on technical skills which will enable them to contribute towards industrial economy in Tanzania.

Hon. Samia made the call when she was officiating the OUT's Silver Jubilee on behalf of President John Magufuli on September 24th, 2019 at OUT's Kinondoni temporary Headquarters in Dar es Salaam.

She told the OUT management that the programmes should focus on changing the mindset of Tanzanians especially the youth by providing knowledge that would enable them to be sole contributors and beneficiaries of the industrial economy.

"If we don't acquaint youth with technical skills and knowledge, then we should know that the beneficiaries of industrial economy shall come from other nations," Hon. Samia said.

Hon. Samia assured the OUT's Management about the government's commitment and support on addressing its challenges to ensure that the vast majority of Tanzanians have access to quality and affordable education. She emphasized that President Magufuli is aware of the challenges facing the OUT, including the scarcity of operational funds.

The OUT's Vice Chancellor, Prof. Elifas Bisanda, who had earlier pleaded for government support on its plan for setting up science laboratories in seven zones in the country recapitulated that the planned laboratories will be used to facilitate OUT and community schools science students' experiments.

In addition, the coordinator of the event from the OUT's Gender Unit Mr. Godefroid Mudaheranwa, said the event would be ongoing to address various challenges facing blood in needy due to the deficiencies in the blood bank.

"We will partner with the Safe Blood Center by organizing blood donation concerts as the need of blood in hospitals is particularly high to help pregnant women, children under and accidental injuries." He said

According to the Community Mobilization Officer of the National Health Plan for Safe Blood in the East Region Ms. Mariam Juma, the organization is in desperate need of blood as the demand is high for the service.

"Tanzanians do not wait their relatives to be sick to remember to donate blood; they need to have the habit of donating blood regularly which will be used to treat patients and other high risk groups like cancer patients and patients undergoing surgery." She said.

She acknowledged that the response was satisfactory and thanked the OUT staff as well as other OUT stakeholders and students from the neighboring Ukwamani secondary school for their commitment to accomplish this exercise.

Keep Your Body Warm Avert Elderly Diseases

The Vice Chancellor of the Open University of Tanzania (OUT) Prof. Elifas Bisanda, urged retirees to engage in entrepreneurial activities in order to generate income and enhance their physical and mental health diseases at the World Elder's Day celebrations, held on 1st October, 2019 at the OUT's Kinondoni temporary headquarters in Dar es Salaam.

"It's good to have a vegetable gar-

den that will keep you busy and earn something. Gardening activities also will keep your body warm, strong and away from eldery diseases like diabetes and blood pressure." Said Prof. Bisanda.

He cautioned elders not to isolate themselves because isolation invites feelings of stigmatization and stresses. He advocated for outgoing and intermingling which brings a sense of belonging, interconnectedness and feelings of being loved that in turn revitalizes retirees and elderly.

A retired Police Commissioner and former Dar Es Salaam Police Special Region Commander Suleiman Kova, said "Getting old is not a disease or something terrible but just a psychological and changes of age numbers. Getting old is a process in life and gifts from God, not all people are fortunate to reach that age." Said Kova.

HelpAge International Elderly Association's Health Project Manager Dr. Edwin Mung'ong'o, said despite of various complaints or challenges pertaining to elders health care service delivery scheme Tanzania is doing better compared to many third world countries.

"Tanzania is striving to look after the elderly; however it has not yet managed to alleviate all complaints. I advise all institutions especially Elders Health and Pension Funds Institutions to address these complaints."
