### BRIEF GUIDE TO NEW ADMITTED STUDENTS FOR 2020/2021 ACADEMIC YEAR

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

##### **Dear New Students**

I wish to congratulate each of you, first on having secured your university place and second, for having the good sense to choose to study at OUT. Also, in a special way, I would also like to welcome all our new international students from different countries in the world in particular Namibia, Kenya, Ghana and Ethiopia.

As we are waiting for the official opening and orientation of new academic year in November, 2020, some of you might be having various questions, don't worry we are here to help you. Below are some important questions and answers about OUT that may be helpful to you

##### **Who we are?**

We are currently a single public comprehensive and dedicated Open Distance e-Learning (ODEL) university in Tanzania and East Africa. Open Distance e-Learning is a different way of learning - there is a physical distance between you and your university and learning is also flexible

##### **How is teaching and Learning services delivered?**

Education is delivered through a Blended mode which comprises of mostly online interactivity between lecturers and students with minimum contact (face to face) sessions

The online learning activities are embedded on the e-learning platform known as MOODLE which includes online discussion, online assignment and online lecture, while the face to face sessions are mainly for field/laboratory/research/project work, teaching practice etc.

You will be constantly guided and informed on exact times and venues for each activity by responsible units.

**How do courses run?**

All courses run for one academic year, there is no semester system, dates for the current academic year starts from November 2020 to June 2021. Make sure that you have university almanac that will guide you on important dates such as examinations, real time online teaching, science practicals, field work, teaching practice etc. Taught masters programs are conducted in semester system.

**For how long will I complete my study program?**

Learning at OUT is flexible, so is based on the needs of individual learner; a learner controls what, where and how to learn. However all programs have been structured to enable you to complete your study as in traditional teaching setting eg. You can comfortably complete a bachelor degree within three years.

**When real time online lectures will be delivered?**

In this academic year OUT will offer real time online lectures for all courses using video conference based on Zoom cloud meeting application, you are encouraged to observe a teaching time table provided and join the online classes where you will have opportunity to interact with your lecturer and fellow students.

**Do I need to attend physical classes?**

As stated above, OUT is a distance education university, which means that you study at a distance. We do not offer physical classes, but it is possible to offer some tutorial and evening classes for some programmes, this will be arranged and communicated to you by the respective teaching unit

**How ICT proficient do I need to be?**

In order to pursue studies at OUT, you will at least need to be knowledgeable in basic ICT skills (using the internet, reading and writing emails, word-processing etc). Developing your IT skills is part of the transferable skills you will learn while studying at this university

During orientation you will be introduced to some basic ICT skills that will facilitate your learning process

Furthermore, as a student of the university you need to have any type of computer, tablet or smart phone to aid your learning. However in case you don't have these facilities or access to the Internet, you will be able to use university computing facilities available in our regional centres.

### **Where can I get help in relation to my course or programme?**

For all academic issues, please contact first the respective course instructor or course leader or head of department. Their contact details are found in all regional offices.

### **How is assessment done?**

Throughout your study, you will be required to accomplish two types of assessments; Formative (continuous) and Summative (Final examination). You will be guided on when and how these assessments are carried out

### **Are study awards from OUT similar with those provided in conventional universities?**

YES, OUT is accredited higher learning institution by Tanzania Commission for Universities (TCU), her programs are also recognized nationally and internationally in similar way with any other competent traditional universities.

### **Does OUT provide hostels facilities?**

As a distance learning institution students normally learns from their homes, so OUT does not provide hostel facilities. However students who wish to reside in hostel may contact private providers.

### **Are OUT students also eligible for getting loan from Higher Education Student's loans Board (HESLB)?**

Yes, provided you meet all the eligibility criteria set by HELSB

### **What should I do now before the commencement of academic year in November?**

Contact you're nearest OUT regional centre for further guidance also to collect your admission letter and obtain the university almanac for 2020/21 academic year. International students are advised to contact the Directorate of Links and International Affairs (DLIA) for assistance.

Finally I wish you every success at the OUT and I am confident that you will find it an immensely rewarding experience.
