

President Mwinyi: OUT Design Curricula in Response to the Blue Economy

The President of Zanzibar and chairman of the Revolutionary Council, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi, has appealed to the Open University of Tanzania (OUT) for designing and developing curricula that will enable marine resources experts to propel the blue economy to the ideal level.

President Mwinyi made the appeal during the 40th graduation ceremonies of the Open University of Tanzania, held at Mao Tse Tung stadium, Kikwajuni, Zanzibar.

“In spite of your commendable achievements, you must continue to design more curricula that are responsive to the evolving national and societal needs and aspirations. This in turn will ensure that the university continues to be a centre of Excellency and an important catchment for various experts needed in the implementation of significant national programmes including the Tanzania’s 2020/2025 development plan, Zanzibar’s 2020/2050 Development Vision plan, the blue economy agenda as well as other regional and international initiatives.” Said President Mwinyi.

Deputy Minister of Education Science and Technology, Hon. Omary Juma Panga, on behalf of the substantive Minister, Prof. Joyce Ndalichako, highlighted that the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania under the World Bank-funded Higher Education for Economic Transformation (HEET) project, has allocated Tshs. 20.7 billion for the university’s development projects.

Hon. Panga, said the project will build seven zonal

modern science laboratories across the country that upon completion will tremendously improve the learning and teaching environment for science disciplines and subsequently upscale the enrollment of science students at The Open University of Tanzania. He added that part of this funds will be used to train academics staff, thus improving the quality of academic staff in the university.” Said Hon. Panga.

The Vice Chancellor of the Open University of Tanzania, Prof. Elifas Bisanda, urged authorities responsible for processing and disbursing government loans to higher learning students to consider giving students enrolling at the Open University of Tanzania equal chance of access to the loans, so that more Tanzanians can benefit from the loans offered by their government.

“Despite of being the pioneer university that provide its education through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) in Africa, yet 48% of its students enrolled in 2019/2020 academic year failed to start their studies because of their inability to pay tuition fees. The university’s tuition fee is affordable as students neither needs accommodation nor meal allowances. If the respective loan authorities had accorded them with equal access chance to the loans, many more would have benefited,” Recounted Prof. Bisanda.

During the 40th graduations ceremonies, 3110 students graduated successfully. 1319 (42%) were women. Cumulative university statistics indicates that since its inception in 1992 the university has so far produced 49,668 graduates.

Also, Prof. Bisanda congratulated all the 40th graduation graduates and professed that without successful completion of their studies and their physical presence at the occasion, the ceremonies could have not been as colorful as they were.

The President of the University's Scholars Conference, Prof. Modest Varisanga, pleaded with all the OUT's graduates to cooperate with their university in preparing graduation convocations in the future, which as of now relies solely on the auspices of the university's management.

The 1st Winner of Best ICT Transformative Training Institution Award

Director of the Institute of Education Management and Technology (IEMT) of the Open University of Tanzania (OUT), Dr. Catherine Mkude said the OUT emerged the 2021 academic year's first winner of the Best ICT Transformative Training Institution Award.

“The OUT received the award because it has integrated ICT in its Teaching and Learning activities. As a result, unlike other educational institutions in the country, its teaching activities have not been affected by COVID-19 pandemic” said Dr. Mkude.

Unveiling the reason which enabled

the OUT to emerge the first winner, Dr. Mkude, said the inventiveness of staff in IEMT and ICT department has enabled the university to design and develop its unique E-Systems. The systems make the OUT one of the leading ICT innovators in the education sector in the country.

Head of Department of Training and Consultancies in IEMT, Ms. Jane Bethuel, highlighted some of the systems which have been designed and developed by the OUT which includes, Online Oral Examination System (OREX) which was very useful amid the 2nd Covid 19 wave and electronic filing systems.

Ms. Bethuel enunciated that the filing system has enabled the university to transform from the traditional paper centred filing system into a paperless filing system which enables the OUT HoD's, Deans, Directors and dominant coalition to act on the files even when they are away from their physical office.

The Best ICT Transformative Training Institution Award competition has been organized by the ICT Commission in the country. Various Education Institutions participated in the competition. The aim is to encourage reforms towards better use of ICT in Educational Institutions.

It is also grateful for hosting over 300,000 refugees, bringing its neighboring countries in East and Southern Africa together and indeed for extending its support on building their peace” acclaimed Mahon.

Professor of Medicinal Chemistry Hamisi Malebo, said Covid-19 is not

only a global health threat but it is also a threat to the world peace. He posited that as countries grapple with the pandemic, unbalanced delivery of healthcare can lead to disruption of peace. On psychosocial aspect, the pandemic can cause trauma which may lead to disruption of peace in communities, hence the connection between health and peace is real.

rector, Mr. Deodatus Kinawiro said the International Peace Day is of great importance to Tanzania which has been and still is an 'Island of Peace' in Africa and the world at large.

"If peace has to be sustained, youth must be economically empowered because jobless youths can easily embark on crime acts which could lead into disruption of peace. Given this fact the need for creation of more employment opportunities is imperative"

suggested Mr. Kinawiro.
